Purpose of the Position:

This position is to provide education to renters and prospective renters about their rights and responsibilities and to maintain and develop a network of Community Access Points to provide innovative ways for service users to access to QSTARS services across the central Queensland region.

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Key Accountabilities:

Ensure the delivery of quality education sessions to tenants, residents and prospective tenants and residents within the region as required by the QSTARS CQ Regional Services Coordinator

Ensure the community education needs of the whole central Queensland region are identified and supported

Expand Community Access Points (CAPs) in the central Queensland region and actively maintain ongoing support to all CAPs

Support the aims of Tenants Queensland and comply with all organisational policies and procedures.

Work as a member of a team with other staff and the TQ Chief Executive Officer.

Specific Duties:

Organise and deliver community education within the central Queensland region, ensuring sessions and materials are appropriate for specific population groups.

Identify gaps in community education and promotional materials for the Central Queensland region.

Identify the need as well as opportunities for, and further develop the network of Community Access Points across the central Queensland region.

Work with the Regional Services Coordinator and the other Regional Community Education workers to identify need, delivery strategies and provide input for the development of materials

Support the Statewide Community Education Worker to prioritise needs across the state, develop products and deliver on identified statewide events

Support the Regional Service Coordinator in maintaining partner relationships and participate in representation of the central Queensland region in relevant stakeholder group sessions.

Ensure that the QSTARS Program is appropriately and consistently branded and promoted throughout the central Queensland region.

Work with the Regional Service Coordinator to develop and deliver the central Queensland regional strategies and actions defined in the QSTARS Service Delivery Plan.

Provide feedback from community engagements that can contribute towards the development of TQ law reform and policy.

Undertake administrative duties associated with the performance of the position's specific duties.

Desirable:

Qualifications and experience in Community Education, Adult Education or Human Services or other related areas.
